



#### UNIT HISTORY

#### 1942

The 318th Engineer Aviation Battalion, originally known as the 818th Engineer Battalion, Aviation (Sep) was activated on 10 March 1942, at the Savannah Army Air Base, Savannah, Georgia, (par. 2, General Orders No. 12, Headquarters, Savannah Army Air Base, 10 March 1942). Major Francis X. Purcell, 016380, CE, was assigned to the unit and assumed command thereof on the date of its activation (par. 30, Special Orders No. 42, WD, 18 February 1942). He appointed the only other officer then assigned to the new unit, Capt. Gilbert B. Hall, 021430, CE, (par. 30, Special Orders No. 42, WD, 18 February 1942) as the acting executive officer of the battalion and commanding officer of the only activated company, Headquarters & Service Company. Other than these two officers, the only personnel to join the battalion on its date of activation were Pvt. Salvatore P. DeRosa, 6901175, Pvt. Albert T. Bradley, 39010858 and Pvt. Erford A. Cowden, 11031910, Joined from the ESSC, Ft. Belvoir, Virginia (par. 8, Special Orders No. 24, Headquarters, Ft. Belvoir, 2 March 1942).

From the date of activation until 16 March, no substantial change in the unit took place. On that date, the cadre, formed by the 309th Engineer Battalion, Aviation (Sep), (par. 6, Special Orders No. 63, Headquarters, Westover Field, 12 March 1942) joined the battalion and were assigned to Headquarters & Service Company. The cadre was the foundation on which the unit was established and included such men as Pfc. Robert L. Tremblay, 31026037, Pfc. Valentine Ciskiewicz, 32027700, and Sgt. Patrick J. Sofarelli, 32112594, among others, who were to become key personnel in the outfit.

By the end of March, with the assignment of 2 casuals, the battalion had a strength of 47 enlisted personnel. One of the new men, Sgt. John C. Owens, 34116788, who requested transfer into the unit from the Bomb and Gunnery Range Detachment, Savannah Army air Sase, (par. 9, Special Orders No. 80, Headquarters, Savannah Army air Sase, 21 March 1942) assumed the duties of the battalion motor sergeant. Sgt. Owens became one of the most valuable men in the organization and was to perform his duties so well that he was later decorated for his good work.

Meanwhile, the officer strength of the battalion was climbing rapidly.

1st Lt. Emil D. Bauer, 0389847 who had been in the Air Corps at Savannah Army Air Base, requested assignment to the battalion. The request was approved and Lt. Bauer joined the battalion on 15 March (per. 15, Special Orders No. 65, WD, 13 March 1942). On 16 March, 1st Lt. William E. Betts, Jr, 0301787, CE, (per. 36, Special Orders No. 59, WD, 7 March 1942) joined the organization from MOPS, New Orleans, was assigned to the battalion as Supply Officer. He was followed by an assignment of 11 officers from Ft. Belvoir, Virginia for. 1, Special Orders No. 32, Headquarters, Engineer School, Ft. Belvoir, 16 Harch 1942). On 18 March 1st Lt. Theodore W. Klein, 0322233, CE, 1st Nt. Clarence H. Scranton, 0347216, CE, 2nd Lt. Clay H. Dean, 0373406, CE, 2nd Dt. William A. Gray, 0385084, CE, 2nd Lt. Clay H. Dean, 0373406, CE, 2nd Dt. William A. Gray, 0385084, CE, 2nd Lt. Cowin F. Keifer, Jr, 0436736, CE, 2nd Lt. Lawrence R. McClain, 0417470, 2nd Lt. Rollin C. Smith, 0410675, CE, 2nd Lt. David F. Sylvester, 0365911, CE, 2nd Lt. Carl G. Uppman, 0326558, CE, 2nd Lt. George C. Younie, 0403648, CE, and 2nd Lt. Landon P. Hill, 0412355, CE, Joined the battalion from completion of a refresher course at Ft. Belvoir, Virginia. Except for Lt. Uppman, who was assigned the duties of Battalion Adjutant, the arriving officers were attached to Battalion Headquarters with no special duties, pending further organization of the unit.

In early April, the time had come for a more thorough formation of the unit. The letter companies of the battalion were declared activated on the sixth of the month (General Orders No. 3, Headquarters, 818th Engineer Battalion, Aivation, 6 April 1942). Lt. Scranton and Lt. Sylvester were assigned to Headquarters & Service Company with Capt. Hall and were detailed as Acting Engineering Officer and Acting Personnel Officer respectively.

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Lt. Klein assumed command of the newly formed Company "A", with Lt. Gray and Lt. Keifer as platoon leaders. Company "B" came under the command of Lt. Dean and Lt. Bauer assumed the command of Company "C". Lt. Younie and Lt. McClain were assigned to Company "C" and Lt. Smith to Company "B". Lt. Hill assumed the duties of the Battalion Motor Officer in Headquarters & Service Company. With the assignment of personnel from Headquarters & Service Company consisting, in the main, the original cadre, among the three letter companies, the skeleton of the battalion was now formed.

On the 9th of April, the first officer other than an Engineer Officer reported to the unit. 1st Lt. Irving Seideman, 034,9936, MC, was assigned and became the Battalion Surgeon (par. 17, Special Orders No. 94, Headquarters, Savannah Army Air Bose, 4 April 1942).

The arrival of Capt. George M. Hildreth, 0316632, CE, assigned to the unit (par. 15, Special Orders No. 65, WD, 13 March 1942) necessitated another change in officer assignment. Capt. Hall was relieved of his duties to become the Executive Officer of the battalion. Capt. Hildreth replaced Capt. Hall as commander of Headquarters & Service Company.

With the assignment of this personnel to the companies, the unit began to function. No immediate mission faced the batth in other than its formation. Hampered by lack of equipment and a shortage of experienced personnel, a regular program of training was drawn up and applied. Under the direction of Lt. Hill and the supervision of T/Sgt Silvs A. Albright and Sgt. Owens, training of operators in the use of heavy equipment was initiated. In other departments, personnel were assigned and were being trained in their position by actual experience.

On the 1st of May, the final section of the organization, as such, joined the unit at Savannah. The Medical Detachment of 11 enlisted men reported for duty (par. 6, Special Orders to. 114, Headquarters, Army Air Base, Daniel Field, Augusta, Georgia, 27 April 1942) and were put under the command of Lt. Seideman.

During the month of May, the battalion began to show the results of the efforts being put its organization. Three men demonstrated that they were fit for the osition of first sergeant and were so appointed. 3/3gt. Fatrick J. Socaralli, 32212594, was appointed in Company "C", 3/Sgt. Ed L. Nelson, 6387867, in Company "B" and T/Sgt. Harbert Smith, 6341442, in Company "A". Sgt. Ellis A. Albright became the first Master Sergeant to be appointed in the battalion in the position of construction foreman.

Changes, losses and additions to, reassignment within the battalion occurred frequently during this period. Perhaps the most popular one was the promotion of Maj. Burcell to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel on 11 May 1942 (par. 3, Special Orders No. 125, WD, 11 May 1942). On the 9th of May, the first losses in officer personnel occurred when Lt. Keifer and Lt. Sylvester were transferred to the 815th Engineer Battalion at Pass Christian, Mississippi (par. 2, Special Orders No. 121, Headquarters, Third Air Force, 7 May 1942). To replace Lt. Keifer, Lt. McClain was reassigned to Company "A"; Lt. Uppman assumed the additional duties of the Personnel Adjutant, vacated by Lt. Sylvester. Further changes of this nature occurred shortly after, when Capt. Hildreth was replaced as commander of Headquarters & Service Company by Lt. Scranton, the former taking over the command of Company "B".

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Two new Medical Officers, 1st Lt. Alfred T. Perrine, 0469123, TC, and 1st Lt. Ira V. Chant, 0368097, DC, joined the unit on 27 May and became the Assistant Surgeon and Battalion Dentist (par. 6, Special rders No. 1144, Headquarters, Army Air Base, Hunter Field, Savannah, Georgia, 24 May 1942).

The first movement made by a unit of the battalion occurred on 12 May 1942. It Col. Purcell, the officers of Company "A" and a small detachment from the company departed from the Savannah Army Air Base by troop train to Pass Christian, Mississippi, on temporary duty, in order to pick up 255 enlisted men left at that station by the 815th Engineer Battalion on movement overseas (par. 2, Special Orders No. 132, Headquarters, Savannah Army Air Base, Hunter Field, 12 May 1942). The detachment was never to return to its former station, for shortly after departure, the entire battalion was ordered on a permanent change of station to Pass Christian.

On 19 May, the strength of the unit was increased by the assignment of the 250 enlisted men of the 315th Engineer Battalion (par. 16, Special Orders No. 123, Headquarters, New Orleans Army Air Base, 19 May 1942). The pattalion strength, at least on paper, was 834 enlisted personnel. By actual count, however, the strength of the unit did not come near the paper figure. More than a fifth of the men transferred from the 315th Engineer Battalion were in an absent status, either at schools, sick in the hospital, on furlough, or simply absent without leave. Of those that could be accounted for, many left much to be desired in a soldier. As the men were absorbed and accounted for, a problem of some six months duration, members of this group showed such qualities of leadership and ability that they were placed in important positions in the unit. Among these were Pfc. George W. Ainslie, 3209013, Pvt. Merton H. Roemhildt, 39304178, Pvt. Leo B. Bosch, 37094327 and Pvt. William F. Kubis, 3220L000.

Two weeks after the departure of the detadament to Pass Christian, the remainder of the battalion also made a permanent change to that station. The unit entrained, less Lt. Bauer and Lt. Smith, who departed on temporary duty to Ft. Belvoir (par. 4, Special Orders No. 146, Hq. Savannah Army Air Base, Hunter Field, 26 May 1942), on 29 May 292 to join Company "A" with its newly acquired strength, (par. 2, Special Orders No. 146, Headquarters, Savannah Army Air Base, Hunter Field, 26 May 1942). On the following day, the battalion arrived at its destination and took its station at the Pine Hills Hotel. In contrast to the tented area in which the organization had been situated at Savannah, it now found itself billeted in a large and what might have been luminous hotel. The hotel was a few miles away from the town itself, overlooking Bay St. Iouis, and had been constructed during the twenties for tourist purposes. In scent years it had been abandoned, allowed to deteriorate, and, by the time the Mar Department had taken it over, it was in a dilapidated condition.

The primary mission of the battalion while at this station was construction work on Bombing and Gunnery Range for the Third Air Force. Much headway on the mission was never made, however, Within weeks of arrival, the unit was ordered to it. Dix, New Jersey and then overseas. There was only time at this station to establish the unit after its move, to continue work on its organization, particularly the absorbtion of the new personnel, and, later in preparing for the move to Ft. Dix. In spite of these considerations, Company "A" was able to accomplish some work on the mission. It was limited, however, in making preparations for the project, preparations which were proven valuable to the unit following the 818th into Pass Christian. Such work as the strengthening of bridges on access roads, the preparations of storage points for supplies and such other incidentals necessary to the completion of the mission.

In the matter of personnel, further steps were taken toward organization. Frequent changes were made, particularly in regards to position vacancies and assignment of personnel to subordinate units. Innumerable transfers between subordinate units of the battalion in an effort to more easily assimilate the men acquired from the 815th, to spread those with specific talents to the company where they were most needed, and to cut down the great overstrength that was in Company "A". Much was accomplished along these lines, although Company "A" was to keep the majority of the men from the 815th.

The first tragedy to occur in the battalion was the death of one of its members at Pass Christian. On 1 June Pvt. Arthur I. Lamb, 31068404, was accidentally killed by falling from a truck hauling supplies from Pass Christian to the Pine Hills Hotel.

While at Pass Christian, changes in officer personnel occurred almost daily. In the early part of June, Capt. John Selsemeyer, 0200089, CE, joined the battalion (par. 18, Special Orders No. 143, Headquarters, Third Air Force, 29 May 1942) and replaced the absent Lt. Smith on the staff as Engineering Officer. From the Engineer Officer Candidate School arrived 2nd Lt. James J. Corral, 01100056, CE, and 2nd Lt. Eugene H. Flumacher, 01100388, 2nd Lt. Arthur W. Peabody, 01100282, and 2nd Lt. Edgar R. Pearson, 01100283 (per. 5, Special Orders No. 71, Headquarters, The Engineer School, Ft. Belvoir, Virginia, 28 May 1942). The officers were assigned to Headquarters & Service Company, Personnel Adjutant, Assistant Adjutant and Company "C" respectively. 2nd Lt. Beverly Z. Henry, 0462788, CE, (par. 16, Special Orders No. 137, Head quarters, 4th CA, 9 June 1942) and was assigned to Company "C". 2nd Lt. William C. Harris, Jr, 0465187, CE, reported on 17 June (par. 17, Special Orders No. 136, Headquarters, 4th CA, 17 June 1942) and was assigned to Company "A".

On the 19th of June, six additional officers reported from the insineer Replacement Training Center, Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri (par. 1, Special Orders No. 166, Headquarters, Engineer Replacement Training Center, 1 June 1942). They were assigned as follows: --

1st Lt. Lloyd A. Cutter, 0237183 to Company "A".

1st Lt. Lawrence R. Denney, 0907160 to Company '

lst Lt. Leslie R. Winsauer, 0285584 to Company "D" 2nd Lt. Lee H. Sentman, Jr., 0297673 to Battalion Headquarters, as Assistant Engineering Officer.

2nd Lt. Fred M. Geesler, 0278477 to Company

2nd Lt. Richard J. Angle, 0288316 to Company

With the arrival of these officers and the return of Lt. Bauer and Lt. Smith from Ft. Belvoir, the organization was now up to officer strength, with a total of 30.

At this point, the battalion was called upon to furnish a cadre for the activation of a similiar unit. A sadre of 32 men were selected and departed for Ft. George Wright, Washington, on 17 June, to form the nucleus of the 826th Engineer Battalion, winton (Sep), (par. 1, 30 No. 150, Headquarters, New Orleans Army Air Base, 12 June 1942).

Among the men sens on the cadre were Sgt. Robert T. Cook, 37055852 and Sgt. Harbert Smith Gulle, First Sergeants of Headquarters & Service Company and Company "A" resocravely. They were succeeded by S/Sgt. Salvatore R. DeRosa, 6901175 and Pyt. Francis Schmid, 36045669, who were appointed to the position on 19 June.

In the middle of June, headquarters received word that the battalion was to make potement to Ft. Dix, New Jersey, to prepare for overseas shipment. Less then two weeks were given the battalion to prepare for the movement. This was a difficult assignment, especially for the heavy equipment section, which had to load and ship all equipment by train. Under Lt. Hill and Lt. McClain, who had been transferred to Headquarters & Service Company to Company "A", the heavy equipment was loaded, and, guarded by a detachment of men under the two officers, was the first portion of the unit to depart from Pass Christian (per. 1, Special Orders No. 153, Headquarters, New Orleans Army Air Base, 18 June 1962). The train guard rejoined the unit at Ft. Dix when it arrived there.

The day prior to the movement of the unit to Ft. Dix, the relief of 7 officers from duty with the battalion was announced through the verbal orders of the Commanding Officer, New Orleans Army Air Base. Lt Col. Purcell, Capt. Hildreth, Lt. Scranton, Lt. Elein, Lt. Seideman, Lt. Gray and Lt. Flumacher were the officers concerned. Capt. Hall assumed command of the unit and was found it necessary to reassign the remaining officers among sections of the battalion.

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Capt. Selsemeyer was appointed Executive Officer in addition to his duties as Engineering Officer. Lt. Corral was detailed to replace Lt. Flumacher as Personnel Adjutant. Lt. Pearson and Lt. Geesler were reassigned to Headquarters & Service Company, and Lt. Hill, absent en route to New York with the heavy equipment, was appointed the commanding officer of the company. Lt. Denney was relieved of further duty with Company "A" and assumed the command of Company "B". Lt. Angle was reassigned from Company "B" to Company "A", and Lt. Sentman was relieved of duties as Assistant Engineering Officer and was assigned to Company "C". 1st Lt. Hamilton H. Morrow, Oh60838, MC, joined the organization as a replacement for Lt. Seideman and took over the duties of Battalion Surgeon (par. 1, Special Orders No. 162, Headquarters, Third Air Force, 17 June 1942).

The battalion entrained for Ft. Dix, minus absentees and those to be left behind, from the Pass Christian station, on the morning of 22 June. The trip to the new destination passed with no particular incident. For most the journey was a welcomed rest after the hectic days and nights just passed in preparation for the move. The unit arrived at the Station Area at Ft. Dix on 25 June 1942 (par. 1, Special Orders No. 155, Headquarters, New Orleans Army Air Base, 20 June 1942).

Among the most trying days experienced by members of this battalien were those at Fort Dix. Housed in a tent camp that was far from comfortable and lacking in most conveniences, all sections had to work day and hight to whip the unit into shape for overseas shipment. Less than a week was allowed to complete all preparations for supplies, personnel, administration, etc. The situation was aggravated when, because of the alert status in which the unit was placed, no personnel were to be allowed passes or curloughs. This was particularly difficult for men from the Eastern States, the having been informed that they were to be shipped to an unknown destination, were desirous of seeing family and friends before embarkation. The aresult, absence without leave for a few hours became a problem throughout the battalion and raised have with sections charged with personnel accounting and supply matters.

An interesting note which was new at Ft. Dix was the introduction of the unit into security matters. The battalion was known as Task Force 5152-A, and its address became APO 1206, c/o Fatnaster, New York City. Under no conditions was the name 818th Engineer Battalion to be placed on correspondence or other instrument.

Prior to embarkation, four new officers were sent to the battalion.
2nd Lt. Albert F. Wiedeman, 01100393, 2nd Lt. Lawrence A. Widowski, 01100391,
2nd Lt. Carl M. Merbits, 0462112 and Irving P. Golden, 0453380, joined and
were assigned to Company "B", Company "A" and Company "C" respectively (par. 1, Special Orders No. 150, Headquarters, Will Rogers Field,
20 June 1942).
21 June 1942).

Lt. Betts was lost temporarily to the battalion. As the Supply Officer he was placed on temporary duty with the New York Fort of Embarkation to look after the supplies of the battalion as they were shipped, (Letter Orders, WD, NYL), & June 1942). Not until September, when the unit was well situated in England, did Lt. Betts rejoin.

On the 29th of June, the day before embarkation, 78 enlisted men were transferred to the battalion from the 820th Engineer Battalion on the verbal orders of the Commanding Officer, Task Force Replacement Pool. These men were transferred to the battalion on the basis of requisitions submitted daily to bring the unit up to strength, and they reported on the night before departure, (Special Orders No. 49, Headquarters, 818th Engineer Battalion, Aviation, 29 June 1942). Some of the new additions became key men of the unit, included among them were Pvt. Robert L. Hachtel, 38086545, Pvt. Charles C. Garrison, 39385386, Pvt. Jack I. Goldner, 32218228, Pvt. Franklin Arnold, Jr., 37113835 and Pvt. John Bongiovanni, 32214887.

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On 30 June, Task Force 5152-A, with a strength of 28 officers and 762 enlisted men boarded the train at Ft. Dix, the morning of 30 June, en route to the New York Port of Embarkation (Letter Orders, Headquarters, Ft. Dix, New Jersey, 29 June 1942, File 370.5, Subject: "Movement Orders +++++++++ 5152++++++++"). Detraining took place in Jersey City, New Jersey, where the organization was loaded into ferries bound for the docks in Brooklyn. On the afternoon of 30 June, the battalion boarded the USAT "Argentina". The "Argentina" sailed from the port at approximately 0530 hours, and the 818th Engineer Aviation Battalion was on its way on overseas service.

The trip to the destination was made without visible incident. Protected, in convoy with destroyers, crusiers and even a battleship, no sign of enemy activity was noted. The uncomfortable aspects of the journey arose from the crowded conditions of the ship. Men were quartered everywhere, even on the open decks. Feeding was a distinct problem, but as organization became stabilized, the chow line, as well as other problems that could possibly be surmounted, were solved. The calm and relatively fair weather that prevailed assisted in making conditions more pleasant, and only very few members suffered any aftereffects from life on the ship.

The officers fared better than the rest of the battalion. Statemoons on the "Argentina" were assigned to officers, six to a room, complete with three triple decker bunks. Food, served in the main salon, could not have been improved, although it was possible to serve only breakfast and super each day.

Life on the "Argentina" was another rest for all, and, again, was most welcomed after the days at Ft. Dix. There was not much in the way of diversion, and most of the day was spent in sleeping, reading and eating. Playing cards became a favorite pastime. On the 4th of July, a small program was arranged over the public address system and was enjoyed.

While on shipboard, the battalion again undergent a further reshuffle of officer assignments. On 5 July, Battalion leadquarters, operating from what had formerly been the ship's ladies showers, amounced the following changes: Lt. Winsauer was relieved of command of Company "A" and was appointed the Engineering Officer, vice Capt. Selsemeyer, Lt. Uppman, the adjutant, took over command of the company and was spreaded in his position by Lt. Peabody. Lt. Cutter was reassigned from Company "A" to the staff and became the Supply Officer, replacing Lt. Betts, absent on temporary duty, who was assigned to Company "A". The organization, as it was now formed, underwent relatively few changes for months to come.

Also while on shipboard edlisted men of the battalion were promoted all along the line. Among the most important of these promotions were those of Ralph Nyborg, 32198966, to First Sergeant, Headquarters & Service Company, replacing Sgt. DeRosa, Valentine Ciskiewicz, 32027700, to T/Sgt., Chester L. DeFreese, 35171501, to the same grade and Edward C. Kilauff to the grade of Staff Sergeant.

had a rived announcing the promotion of Lt. Hill, Lt. McClain, Lt. Up man, Lt. Dean, Dt. mith, Lt. Younie to 1st Lt., did not catch up with the unit until a few days before sailing, (par. 21, Special Orders No. 161, MD, 18 June 1942 and par. 21, Special Orders No. 162, MD, 19 June 1942). Most of these officers were unable to replace the gold bars with the silver ones until they had boarded the ship.

The "Argentina" dropped anchor at Greenoch, Scotland, on 12 July. For two days the unit remained on board, awaiting orders to disembark for its final destination. On 14 July, the battalion disembarked, was ferried to Greenoch and, under the guidance of a few RAF officers, entrained on a two section train heading for Great Dummow, Essex, England, At about 0200 hours, 15 July, the battalion detrained at the station in Great Dummow, where trucks of the 815th Engineer Battalion were waiting to transport the unit to its camp. Within a short time, the battalion found itself in a tented camp erected by the 815th Engineer Battalion for use of the battalion in Easton Park, Great Dummow, an estate of the Earl of Varwick, its destination.

The first three months on this site were a real experience for the unit. Left alone, under canvas, in the middle of an English park, with the worst - 7 -

summer weather imaginable, life was not too pleasant. Only the novelty of being overseas eased the situation. And there were no higher headquarters to lend a helping hand. Headquarters, ETO, only recently converted from USAFBI, in London, could give little information other than that the battelion was considered to be troops of the Services of Supply. Only the Royal Air Force and the Air Ministry seemed to know the whys and wherefores of our presence in the United Kingdom. Rations and nearly all other supplies necessary for existence were drawn from the RAF, and information as to the mission of the battalion and the supplies necessary therefor were furnished by the Air Ministry.

Left on its own as it was, the unit nevertheless began to function. Through the Air Ministry, plans outlining mission of the unit were obtained. They called for the completion of a full scale aerodrome, RAF standard, with all accessories. It was a collossal task, one for which this unit was not equipped in strength, specialists and equipment, and supplies for the work were not readily forthcoming. Nevertheless, construction was commenced within three days of arrival with the equipment on hand. Through the efforts of Lt. Cutter, the heavy equipment of the unit slowly but steadily began to arrive. The Air Ministry, through its Resident Engineers and the civilian contracting firm of Walter Lawrence and Sons, through their Mr. Warren, were able to order supplies on a gradually increasing schedule. As the battalion became experienced through the work, and as supplies increased, construction on the three main runways and the living sites on the drome were soon under full swing. The problems of supplies of all kinds, however, were a drawback to construction that were never adequately ironed out.

The first runway to be completed was the main runway of the drome. The finishing touches were put on this strip of concrete over a mile long, 150 feet wide and 6 inches thick on 20 November 1942. A week later, a "Tiger Moth", a small training plane of the RAF, had the honor of becoming the first plane to land at the field.

Though it was a novelty for the members of the unit to be in England, this sensation was mild compared to the shock received by the citizens of Great Dunmow. Overnight, without warning, on the outskirts of this rural English town, some 800 Yanks had suddenly appeared. It is safe to say that none of the population had seen an American before. For at least a week after arrival, the citizens of the town could do little more than stare at officers and men as they went to and from the town. It was through the efforts of Col. P. N. Anstruther, the local British Army commander, commanding the West Essex Sub-District, and his wife that a program of represional facilities for the troops of the battalion worked out. Arrengements were made for the invitation of soldiers to British homes, for dances, for the opening of a restmurant and other facilities that the limited resources of Great Dunmow could offer.

In August, the battalion was effectively brought into the U. S. Army chain of command. Provious to that time, Headquarters, SOS was the immediate higher headquarters, and not much was seen of their representatives. They had been operative only short while. The Eastern Base Section, SOS, was activated at Watford, Herts, and the battalion was attached to this command, although it was considered to be assigned to the Eighth Air Force. For practical purposes, the assignment to the Eighth Air Force meant little, and the unit came under the command of the Commanding Officer, Eastern Base Section. Colonel Ewart G. Plank, CE, was the commander of the section during most of the period. In regards to the engineer troops of the command, his Engineer, Colonel J. E. Vollmar, CE, was given command function and direct supervision of all activities in which engineer units were engaged.

By October, the living sites consisting of Nissen huts were completed and available to the line companies for occupation. Headquarters and Headquarters & Service Company were moved into Easton Lodge and the surrounding buildings. The new quarters, along with the shift to American rations, proved to be a big factor in the lift of morale within the organization. The wather up to this time had been cold, misty and rainy, and the control of mud was almost impossible. Under these conditions, living in tents, with few facilities for washing and bathing, had grown steadily worse. The Missen huts sites, when properly established, proved to be excellent answer to the situation. And the Lodge, though the worse for wear and lack of care, proved warm and contained the rudiments of the home comforts, not the least of which were baths with hot running water.

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Regarding the Lodge, a word should be said concerning the graciousness of Mrs. Dora Greville, a member of the Warwick family and the owner of the estate. Her kindness and cooperation when the lodge was taken over by the command was appreciated by all.

As the months went past, the work on the mission became standardized. The men of the battalion labored a ten hour day, with work continuing seven days in the week, through snow, rain, in mud or otherwise. The usual day off rest, Sunday, was thing of the past. Personnel were given a day off rest each week, in rotation, when military necessities did not interfere. One day of the week was reserved for training purposes, for the battalion was not allowed to forget it was a military organization while engaged on a construction task.

In other phases, the unit was becoming static. Hans for the aerodrome indicated that the unit could expect a long stay at its present station and steps were taken accordingly. Improvements were made on the Lodge and in the Nissen sites. A theater was set up and motion pictures shown each night. By the end of the year, the organization was operating under conditions similiar to the garrison conditions in the United States.

Except for the gruelling work and the long hours, the only other indication reminding the troops of the unit that they were operating in a theater of operations were the frequent night raids by the Luftwaffe. Up to the end of 1942, the raids on London, and particularly on such nearby to me us Chelsmford, Braintree and Colchester were felt by the bat alion. On ingreduent occasions, bombs were dropped within less than five miles from Easton Park, and on one occasion, a bomb landed in Great Easton, a matter of two miles away. The unit was fortunate, however, in having no damage done to the station at any time and suffered no casualties through enemy action.


Additional tasks were assigned to the battelion during this period. A detachment of Company "B", under Lt. Wiedeman, was detailed to Chipping Ongar, Essex, on 14 August, to set up a camp for the 831st Engineer Battalion, which was expected to arrive (Special Orders No. 63, Headquarters, 818th Engineer Battalion, Aivation, 17 August 1942). On 11 October, Company "A", less Lt. Angle and detachment, was sent to detached service to Sharnbrook, Bedfordshire, to assist in the unloading of bombs at Air Force Ordnance Depot 583 (Special Orders No. 88, Headquarters, 818th Engineer Battalion, Aviation, 31 October 1942).


The first officer of the bettalion who was promoted while in the United Kingdom was Capt. Hall. His Majority, issued from Washington, was granted on 22 August 1942 (par. 1, Special Orders No. 226, WD, 22 August 1942). His promotion was followed by that of Lt. Bauer and Lt. Winsauer to Captain on 29 October, and Lt's Pabbody, Pearson and Wiedeman to the rank of 1st Lt, same date (par. 20, Special Orders No. 139, Headquarters, ETOUSA, 29 October 1942).


The only other changes which occurred among the officers of the unit were announced on 30 November. Capt. Bauer was relieved of command of Company "C" to assume command of Company "A" and Lt. Younie was appointed commander of Company "C". Capt. Uprman was reassigned from Company "A" to Headquarters & Service Company and assumed command. Lt. Hill became the leader of the service platoon thereof, and Lt. McClain the heavy equipment officer. Lt. Pearson was relieved of duties as Transportation Officer of Headquarters & Service Company and was assigned to Company "C".


Among enlisted personnel, the main trend was the loss in strength. Numerous transfers out of the battalion were made at the request of Headquarters, IBS and Headquarters, SOS. The majority of these transfers concerned truck drivers and clerks, specialists much needed. Others, such as S/Sgt. Lowell H. Sandman, 37094514, were returned to the United States to attend Officer Candidate School. S/Sgt. Charles J. Seested, 32198953, was one of those who returned home to become an Aviation Cadet. Two other men were lost to the unit through death. On 6 October, Pvt. Jacob G. Yingling, 35046680, was suffocated to death when he was caught beneath the closing bed of his dump truck. Pvt. Armando Coppola, 32199043, took his own life with his rifle on 18 November.


